### **COVID Updates**

Florida is currently experiencing a surge in COVID-19 cases, therefore, please review the email sent to all families on January 3rd from St. Lucie Pubic Schools. It contains important information regarding COVID-19. Florida law prohibits requiring students to wear a face mask. However, a parent, at the parent's sole discretion may allow his/her child to wear a face mask. We strongly encourage face mask use and following all guidelines set by the CDC and St. Lucie County Department of Health. Parents must use the Daily Home Screening Tool to assess their child's health every morning. Any student displaying any of the symptoms listed must stay home to protect the safety and well-being of others. While at school, if your child reports to the clinic exhibiting one of the symptoms on the screening tool, parents will be called to pick up their child and he/she must stay home until symptom free and fever free without fever reducing medications for 24 hours. If someone in your family tests positive for COVID-19 or is awaiting test results, we ask that you please keep your child(ren) at home and contact Mr. Keelor or Mrs. DeGarmo at (772) 345-3245.

Florida law prohibits requiring students to wear a face mask. However, a parent, at the parent's sole discretion may allow his/her child to wear a face mask.

### Daily Home Health Screening Tool

Continue to use the Daily Home Health Screening Tool as a check each morning with your student before sending them to school. If your student is displaying any symptoms of illness they must stay home until the are symptom free and fever free without fever reducing medication for 24 hours.



## **Daily Home Screening for Students**

Parents: Please complete this short check each morning with your child or children before

### Symptoms

Does your child have any of the following symptoms, that indicates a possible illness that may decrease the student's ability to learn and also put them at risk for spreading illness to others? Please check your child for these symptoms.

Yes	No	Cold-like symptoms, runny nose, coughing or sneezing.		
Yes	No	Temperature 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher		
Yes	No	Sore Throat		
Yes	No	New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (for students with chro allergic/ asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline)		
Yes	No	Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain		
Yes	No	New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever		

If the student/parent/caregiver answers YES to any of the above questions in Section 1, the student <u>must</u> stay home until symptom-free for at least 24 hours without fever reducing medications.

### If the student answers YES to any question in Section 1, then:

- If positive test for COVID, student should stay home for 10 days until symptom free and at least 24 hours without fever reducing medications. If these criteria are met, the student does not need a negative test or doctor's note to return to school.
- If student has a negative COVID test obtained during current symptoms, student should stay home until fever free for at least 24 hours and all other symptoms have gone away.

### COVID-19 Vaccinations

SLPS encourages all eligible individuals age 5 years old and older to be fully vaccinated, including the recommended booster shots. Please visit <u>Florida Department of Health (floridahealth.gov)</u> to find a COVID-19 vaccination site.

#### COVID-19 Testing

SLPS has partnered with Allied Health to host an on site COVID-19 testing location at Manatee Academy. The site is open Monday — Friday, from 8:30 A.M. until 1:30 P.M. Continue to monitor the SLPS social media sites for updated information and new sites.
